

CONFIDENTIAL SEXUAL VIOLENCE ADVOCATE (CSVA) PROGRAM & 24-HOUR MULTILINGUAL HELPLINE



We operate the countywide 24-hour multilingual sexual assault helpline which is staffed 24/7 by CSVA advocates. Confidential sexual violence advocates have a pivotal role in Hudson S.P.E.A.K.S Against Sexual Violence. All our volunteers/advocates are trained to assist in crisis intervention, provide community resources and referrals, and to support anyone who has questions or is looking for information related to sexual violence.

INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING & SUPPORT GROUP

Harmful and lasting psychological impacts of sexual violence can be prevented or minimized with structured interventions and support post-sexual violence. We have trained counselors who can help process trauma and start the healing journey. Voces Sin Fronteras is a free and confidential support group for individuals who have experienced sexual assault.

OUTREACH PROGRAM

Hudson Speaks' Outreach & Prevention team actively engages in community events to raise awareness about available resources and foster connections. Through organizational presentations and participation in health fairs, volunteer expos, and resource events, we work to educate and empower the community.

In 2024, the Outreach team participated in approximately 115 events, including tabling at resource fairs, schools, and community gatherings, as well as delivering presentations on Hudson Speaks' services and topics like healthy relationships. Communities reached include Jersey City, Bayonne, Union City, North Bergen, Secaucus, Kearny, Hoboken, Harrison, Weehawken, Guttenberg, East Newark, and West New York.

These efforts underscore Hudson Speaks' commitment to prevention and education, ensuring communities have access to vital support and information.

PREVENTION & TRAINING PROGRAM -MEDIA LITERACY

Youth, being at high risk for both perpetration and victimization of sexual violence, are a crucial focus of our prevention efforts. We employ a comprehensive approach, providing an interpersonal violence prevention curriculum for youth and their parents. This research-based project enhances knowledge of interpersonal violence and develops skills to link bystander intervention, power structures, and media literacy to violence prevention.

CASE MANAGEMENT ADVOCACY & SUNSHINE PROJECT (WELLNESS PROGRAM)



Through case management services, we are able to help individuals access services such as housing, public assistance, health insurance and more. Our case worker also provides accompaniments to police precincts, court, medical appointments, interviews with Special Victims Unit and other emergency services.



The goal of the Sunshine Project is to uplift, elevate and empower survivors of trauma. It provides primary and secondary survivors with a holistic method of treatment. We hope that through the support of the Sunshine Project, survivors will achieve stability in their lives by accessing our social services support and wellness activities. These activities include: yoga, art, knitting, and more to meet the needs and interests of survivors.

CULTURALLY SPECIFIC INITIATIVES

Hudson S.P.E.A.K.S. Against Sexual Violence has two culturally specific initiatives: Bolo Behen (Speak Sister), South Asian Initiative, and Voces Sin Fronteras, Hispanic/Latinx initiative. Our mission is to create a safe space with a full range of culturally sensitive and language-specific information, support services and advocacy to these two communities.



Voices without Borders

Release Bolo Behen Speak Sister

Voces Sin Fronteras, Hispanic/Latinx initiative, offers weekly support groups for survivors, free English and Zumba/Yoga classes at Save Latin America. A South Asian initiative of Hudson SPEAKS

Bolo Behen (Speak Sister) offers
English, computer and financial
literacy classes to survivors.
Program also holds community chai
groups where survivors are invited
to express their issues and concerns
fearlessly, openly and comfortably.

Both of these initiatives host major celebratory events in the community. These events serve as a beacon of hope and joy, allowing the community and survivors to come together in a positive and uplifting environment. They celebrate the resilience and strength of survivors, while also providing a sense of normalcy and joy that can be therapeutic.



SEXUAL VIOLENCE STATISTICS

NISVS 2011 data shows that "most sexual violence victims knew their perpetrator. Nearly half of female victims were raped by an acquaintance (46.7%) or an intimate partner (45.4%). For males, 44.9% were raped by an acquaintance and 29% by an intimate partner. The impact is significant, with 81% of women and 35% of men reporting short or long-term effects like PTSD. Furthermore, health care costs rise by 16% for women sexually abused as children, and by 36% for those who suffered both physical and sexual abuse" (NSVR, Statistics in Depth)

According to the CDC, over 80% of female rape survivors experienced their first assault before 25, and nearly half were first raped as minors. Similarly, almost 80% of male victims were forced to penetrate someone before 25. with about 40% experiencing this as minors (National Center for Injury Prevention and Control. Division of Violence Prevention).

PREVENTION

In 2024, Hudson Speaks received 700 hotline calls from victims and survivors of sexual violence. Outreach has participated in over 100 events. These events range from tabling at resource fairs, to giving presentations on Hudson Speaks, Healthy Relationships, and Consent. Communities we've reached include Jersey City, Bayonne, Union City, North Bergen, Secaucus, Kearny, Hoboken, Harrison, Weehawken, Guttenberg, East Newark, and West New York.

In 2022, NJ CASA reported that 1,091 outreach requests were responded to by countybased programs, one of those being Hudson S.P.E.A.K.S. against sexual violence. The organization served over 22,000 survivors that year, providing services like counseling, hotline support, SART activations, and outreach.



The 7th Annual Red Saree Event brought together approximately 200 attendees for a vibrant and empowering gathering to raise awareness about domestic and sexual violence within the South Asian community. This momentous event united key stakeholders, activists, and public figures to emphasize the critical role of community involvement in addressing these pressing issues.

Celebrating womanhood, sisterhood, and the symbolic color red—representing power, strength, and passion—the event fostered dialogue and solidarity. It highlighted the importance of collective action in creating a supportive and inclusive environment for survivors and their families.

The event served as a powerful reminder of the need to work together to build a safer, more equitable future for the South Asian community.

¿Qué es la Agresión Sexual?

- Cualquier contacto sexual no deseado o forzado, sin consentimiento. Esto incluye tocar a alguien en áreas íntimas aun cuando tenga ropa interior o ser obligado a tocar a alguien en áreas íntimas.
- Penetración vaginal, oral o anal no deseada mediante cualquier objeto, sin importar el grado de penetración.
- Sexo con consentimiento con una víctima que tenga una discapacidad mental o sea menor de 16 años.
- Sexo con una víctima que se encuentra incapacitada (ebria, drogada o bajo los efectos de una sustancia).

Si Sufre Agresión Sexual

- Llame a nuestra Línea de ayuda las 24 horas del día. Un defensor confidencial contra la violencia sexual lo escuchará sin culparlo, le ofrecerá información y opciones, y apoyará sus decisiones. Si lo solicita, el defensor lo acompañará durante todos los procesos médicos y legales.
- Busque atención médica para tratar posibles lesiones, y para prevenir enfermedades de transmisión sexual y embarazo.
- Si considera presentar cargos penales, el equipo médico utilizará un "kit de violación" para recoger pruebas forenses. Si es posible, NO se duche, bañe, lave ni coma, beba, orine o se cambie la ropa, ya que podría arruinar las pruebas del delito. Si usted realizó alguna de las actividades que se mencionaron antes, aún se pueden recoger pruebas forenses.
- Considere dar aviso a la policía.
- Considere recibir asesoramiento de inmediato. Las investigaciones indican que las víctimas de violación que reciben terapia justo después de la agresión tienen menos probabilidades de desarrollar síntomas de trastorno por estrés postraumático (Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, PTSD).

The Sunshine Project

Sexual Violence

At Hudson Speaks, the Yoga Workshop provides a supportive and nurturing environment for trauma survivors, focusing on holistic healing for both the body and mind. With a steady group of 5-7 participants, these sessions embody the community's dedication to self-care and recovery.

Yoga has proven to be an invaluable tool in the healing process, helping to regulate the body's stress response, lower cortisol levels, and foster a deep sense of calm. Through mindful breathing techniques and gentle movements, participants develop essential skills to manage emotions, reduce anxiety, and alleviate symptoms of depression.

These workshops empower individuals to reconnect with their bodies- an essential step in reclaiming control and building resilience after experiencing trauma. Hudson Speaks remains committed to supporting survivors on their journey to recovery through this transformative practice.





Hudson Speaks hosted a Denim Day event at the hospital during Sexual Assault Awareness Month to emphasize an important message: What we wear should never dictate how we are treated.

Denim Day is a global movement that started as a response to a 1998 Italian Supreme Court ruling which overturned a rape conviction, citing that the victim's jeans were "too tight" and implied consent. This decision sparked outrage and solidarity worldwide, with Denim Day becoming a symbol of protest against victim-blaming and a call to support survivors of sexual violence.

Hudson Speaks' event brought together hospital staff, patients, and community members to raise awareness and foster a conversation about consent, respect, and breaking harmful stereotypes. By wearing denim, participants expressed their commitment to standing against sexual violence and supporting survivors. This initiative aligns with Hudson Speaks' dedication to empowering victims and educating the community on creating a culture of accountability and respect.
